But you have this in your favor: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. (Rev 2:6)

My pastor's report for the Congregational Annual Meeting centered around Jesus' proclamation to the angel of the Ephesus church in Revelation 2. One of Jesus' statements referenced the practices of Nicolaitans. Who were the Nicolaitans? What are their practices

which is so hated by Jesus? What can this statement about the Nicolaitans teach us about our Christian life?

There are only two Biblical Nicolaitan references: Rev 2:6 & 15. Both refences reflect their presence and influence on first century Christian churches. Other Christian and secular historians near this time period shed light on the practices of the Nicolaitans. Second century Christian historian Clement of Alexandria made the following quote of the Nicolaitans, "They abandoned themselves to pleasure like goats, leading a life of self-indulgence."

The Nicolaitans can be a cautionary tale of perverting Jesus' message of salvation to indulge in sinful actions. When Paul was writing to the Colossians, he was aware of how believers can be misled. See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the basic principles of this world rather than on Christ. (Colossians 2:8) The Nicolaitans were one of the early sects with gnostic tendencies. The Gnostics claimed that Jesus' salvation is only for the spirit within and has no connection to the physical presence. Since the spirit and physical have no connection, then the actions of the physical body have no impact on our salvation. To accommodate this deceptive philosophy followers of this gnostic thought would rewrite or remove Scripture references to the physical presence of Jesus and moral laws of Old and New Testament teaching.

The temptation to follow this toxic way of thinking of which Jesus hates is still very present in our world today. When morality is defined by desired actions like adultery, marriage beyond one man and one woman, drunkenness and dividing people into multiple human races, then principles of this world are regarded as truths over and against God's Word.

May the fullness of God's Word be your guide as we navigate this life we live together at Wangen Prairie.

Directions:



Serves one entire home forever.


